"I have set my rainbow in the clouds, and it will be the sign of the covenant between me and the earth." ([Genesis 9:13](#))

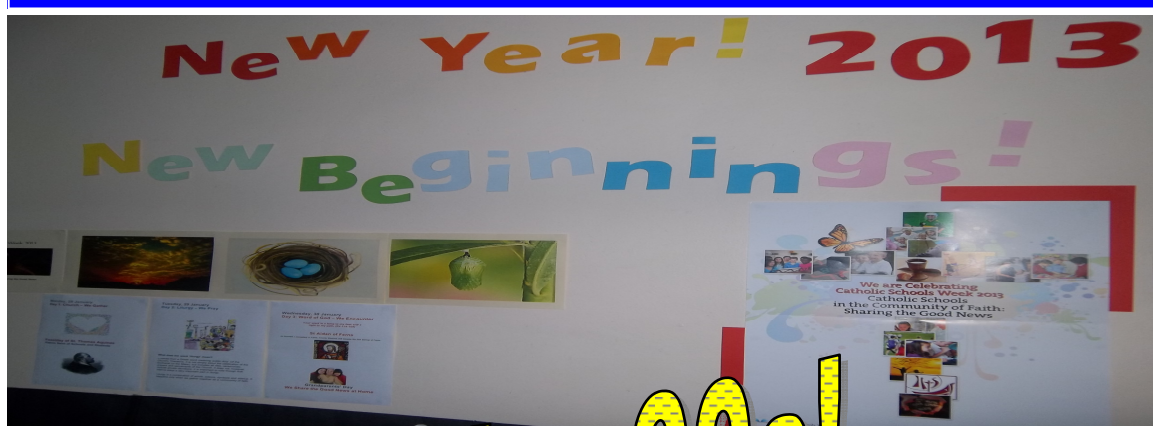

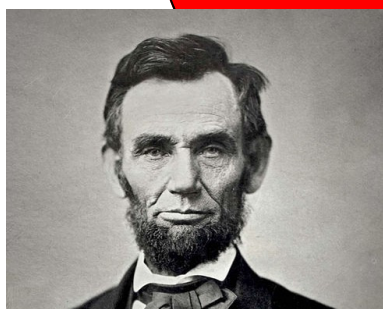


## Back to the 60s!
