

SCHOLARSHIPS



Trinity College

Entrance Exhibitions

Awarded to new entrants provided that sufficient merit is shown in Leaving Certificate results. Each exhibition is in the form of a book prize. Exhibitioners and their parents/guardians are invited to attend a ceremony during their first term. The schools in which exhibitioners received their post-primary education are informed.

Sizarships

Sizars are Entrance Exhibitioners of limited means who have Commons (evening meal) free of charge. Application to be considered for the award of a sizarship should be made on or before 15 October of the year of entry.

Sizarships are normally tenable for the first two years of an undergraduate course.

Trinity College

Sport scholarship

Sport scholars should be competing at the highest national level possible in their chosen sport and have been offered a place in the University. The closing date is generally the first week in October.

Choral Scholarships – Trinity College Chapel Choir

Eight Choral Scholarships valued at €1,300 are available for all voices.

The choral scholars form the core and leadership of the Chapel Choir: a mixed-voice choir of about twenty-five singers which performs in a liturgical context. The choir also leads the congregation in the said parts of the service. Some previous choral experience is an advantage and the ability to read music is essential.

Application is made during Freshers' Week (the first week in Trinity); an appointment for an audition before the selection committee is then made.

Sports Scholarships

- 1. Athlete Support Programme:** is an athlete led development programme whereby financial assistance and a network of support services are designed to meet the individual needs of elite and high performance athletes. The offer of a place on the Athlete Support Programme does not include any special reductions in entry criteria or the offer of an academic place at DIT. - 2. Elite Athlete Academic Entry Scheme:** Successful applicants are offered up to a max. of 10% or 45 additional CAO points for admission to all undergraduate programmes. First year students who enrol on some Business courses with over 500 Leaving Certificate points will be awarded a first year entrance scholarship of €1,000 in recognition of their outstanding performance in the Leaving Certificate Examination. Entrance Scholars

Entrance Scholar awards are presented to first year students who achieve 560 points or more in their Leaving Certificate in recognition of their academic accomplishment to date. No application is required and recipients are automatically informed.

Benefits - Recipients are presented with a recognition certificate at a ceremony in November each year and their achievements are recorded on their academic transcript.

Ad Astra Academic Scholarships

Awarded on the basis of the academic criteria of 6 higher H1s in the first sitting of the Leaving Cert, as well as an online application. The application consists of a personal statement and a statement of achievement 'beyond the classroom'. Applications open on 1st February and close on 21st August. Following the release of the CAO offers, shortlisted students will be invited for interview and successful candidates will be notified before the start of the academic year.

Ad Astra Performing Arts Scholars

The Ad Astra Performing Arts programme offers opportunities to students who excel in music or drama and who wish to develop their performance talents while pursuing a degree in UCD. Scholars benefit from a scholarship, mentoring, a range of tailored supports. Prospective students must apply before January 31st of the year of entry.

UCD Choral Scholars

This is a scholarship-only ensemble of 18 singers which performs regularly in concert, at college events, on radio and television, tours and competes internationally on behalf of UCD and undertakes a high level of training activities with guest artists. Bursaries are made to successful applicants.

Incoming UCD students may apply for audition and interview which are held in September of each year.

UCD Symphony Orchestra Scholars

UCD Symphony Orchestra Scholarships are awarded to talented students in key positions within UCD Symphony Orchestra. These scholars join other talented students in major performances at home and on tour with professional musicians and conductors. These students also perform together as UCD Orchestral Scholars on occasion during the academic year.

Incoming UCD students may apply for audition and interview which are held in September of each year.

Ad Astra Sports Scholars programme

The UCD Ad Astra Sports Scholars programme supports students who are competing and succeeding at the highest sporting levels. Ad Astra Sports Scholars regularly represent Ireland on the international stage including.

Prospective students must apply before January 31st of the year of entry.

UCD Sports Scholarships

The aim of the UCD Sports Scholarship programme is to give talented students the opportunity of developing their sporting career by offering the highest standards in coaching, training, nutrition, strength and conditioning advice, while they are studying for a degree in UCD.

Recipients have the potential to compete at the highest national level, and above, in a particular sport. The value of each scholarship is assessed on an individual basis and may be used to off-set costs such as accommodation, books, fees and travel to competitions etc.

Applications will open on the 1st February.

Irish Language Student Residence Scheme

Students from various subject areas have the opportunity to live and work together as *Gaeilge*, while further developing their individual talents through a range of social and cultural activities. *Bord na Gaeilge* offers scholarships to 24 students who are fluent Irish speakers and who have the desire and the ability to initiate projects which promote the use of the language.

Academic Scholarship Programme

Incoming students are awarded €500 by gaining a CAO points' requirement through the Leaving Certificate. The points' requirement for students who wish to study a course in the following faculties is as follows:

- ▶ **Faculty of Engineering and Computing: 550+ CAO points**
- ▶ **Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences: 550+ CAO points**
- ▶ **Faculty of Science and Health: 550+ CAO points**
- ▶ **Dublin City University Business School: 550+ CAO points**
- ▶ **DCU Institute of Education: 550+ CAO points**

There is no application process. If students gain the stated number of points, meet the specific entry requirements and register in DCU, they will automatically receive the scholarship.

In addition to the monetary award, the students, along with their parents or guardians and former school principals, will be invited to come to DCU for an awards ceremony where the former school principal will receive a plaque for the school marking this significant achievement.

Sports Scholarship Programme

The DCU Sports Scholarship programme offers a wide range of support services for talented athletes as part of a balanced approach to training, performance and academic excellence.

Sport Scholarships are only offered to students that have met the DCU admission requirements through the CAO system and are enrolled on a programme of academic study at DCU. The offer of a Sport Scholarship award does not include any special reductions in entry criteria or the offer of an academic place at DCU.

Elite Sportsperson Academic Entry Scheme

DCU has put in place a special academic entry scheme for elite sports persons across a number of undergraduate degree courses. A number of academic places are reserved for outstanding candidates who have achieved a very high level of performance, competing at one or a combination of international, national, inter-provincial and inter-county level. Under this scheme, applications are not assessed solely on the basis of academic performance, but sporting achievements are also taken into consideration.

To be eligible, applicants must apply through the CAO before the normal closing date and submit the online Elite Sports Persons Application Form before 1st May.

Intel Shannon Women in Technology Scholarship

To increase awareness and encourage high-achieving women to take up the challenge of a career in science & technology.

Scholarship is worth €3,000 per annum, for those entering specified undergraduate honours degree courses in science, technology & engineering.

Also includes opportunities for intern placements or summer internships at the Intel campus. Each student will be assigned a Intel mentor who can assist and provide advice on managing their academic career.

Selection will be by application form and interview of candidates.
